OUR FOOD BANKS

Cornish Food Banks continue to provide food parcels to those families and individuals that have low incomes and cannot afford basic groceries.

Our food banks also provide food for children during the school holidays and also provide baby food and baby provisions, washing products, fuel vouchers and pet food.

At Christmas, most food banks also provide presents for the children of families suffering from food poverty.

The demand for food parcels during the past six months has at least doubled and food banks now serve all the towns and surrounding villages throughout Cornwall.

Harbour Housing provides

accommodation, advice and support to those experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness across Cornwall. The charity has eight properties and also runs an outreach service to prevent those vulnerably housed in the community from losing their accommodation.

Specialising in harm reduction, Harbour supports people who have complex needs which may prevent them from accessing services elsewhere. They are assisted to develop their independence and eventually move on into their own homes. Harbour's programme of support and activities is varied and includes counselling sessions, art classes, volunteering on its small holding, excursions and educational courses, helping people to find value in their lives

and in themselves, and develop their strengths.

Cornwall Refuge Trust provides a safe supportive environment for men, women and children who have escaped domestic abuse. They offer support and advice, empowering survivors of domestic abuse for a safer and happier future.

The charity was founded in 1979 by women from local churches who sought to provide a temporary place of safety for women and children.

The trust has developed and provides a place of safety for up to six women and 14 children in need of escape from domestic abuse. They also now support male victims of domestic abuse and provide refuge accommodation for up to five men and their children.

These families are likely to have fled their home with short notice and therefore

arrive with little more than they are wearing. The items listed below are crucial when they leave.

HOMELESSNESS

TRURO HOMELESS ACTION GROUP

Truro Homeless Action Group (THAG) provides a warm welcome, food and shelter and a regular and safe place for the homeless and vulnerably housed to meet. Around 35 volunteers regularly give two hours a week to provide free cooked breakfasts, seven days a week, 365 days a year. On Christmas Day and Boxing Day we offer a turkey lunch with all the trimmings.

This year's donations will go towards helping us provide breakfasts (£1.50/ person) and the Christmas Day and Boxing Day lunches (£6/person).

As well as food, THAG also provides toiletries, flasks, razors, thermals in winter, along with socks, gloves, hats, scarves and underwear plus, of course sleeping bags and rucksacks.

The Gershie Project in Falmouth aims to help people who are lonely, socially excluded, rurally isolated and people whose lack of interaction with others is negatively impacting upon their lives.

The project, which is named after one of the founders of the Cornwall Independent Poverty Forum, a lady who lived to help others, aims to provide a safe, welcoming space where these people can come together, chat and interact.



We have even been known to provide a complete change of clothing when needed.

THAG was first formed over 22 years ago after the night shelter in St George's Road was closed.

THAG is now based at the Church Hall of St John the Evangelist in Strangways Terrace, Truro.



GERSHIE PROJECT

The project is staffed by volunteers who provide a welcome, support and signposting for agency services. Where the project needs support is help towards the costs of providing a safe and welcoming place.

What your donation could help provide: £10: Equipment for activities;

£20: A welcoming space for one week.

Backpack Beds provide shelter that can help improve the lives of people who face the prospect of rough sleeping on the streets of Cornwall. Cornwall Independent Poverty Forum (CIPF) has distributed over 200 Backpack Beds, in conjunction with key partners who provide support for the homeless in the county.

Backpack Beds are more durable and cost effective than standard sleeping

bags and blankets while being lightweight and fully waterproof.

Each Backpack Bed costs £90 so all donations are very welcome.

Backpack Beds are not the permanent solution to preventing or relieving homelessness: but Backpack Beds do offer a simple short-term solution to help vulnerable people take the first steps away from rough sleeping.

GROWING LINKS CIC's STREET FOOD PROJECT

Growing Links CIC's Street Food

Project (SFP) in Penzance is a hot meal service that operates seven night's a week, 365 days a year. This volunteerled service was created to support Penzance's homeless and/or vulnerably housed, as well as families and individuals suffering from poverty. It is not unusual to serve 40 guests a night.

SFP volunteers cook hearty and nutritious food nightly and use the meal service to engage with members of our community who often feel marginalized by their circumstances. Over dinner and a friendly chat, we offer support and advice by linking people up to other agencies in the local community. SFP, together with volunteers from our Food Store facility, also put together weekly shopping bags of store cupboard essentials for families and individuals in need.

Donations to Growing Links CIC will ensure we are able to continue to provide these vital services to our community's most vulnerable people.

What your donation could help provide:

- £80: the cost of one night's entire meal service:
- £20: one weekly shopping bag for those experiencing food poverty;
- £10: four hot meals.

RAME COMMUNITY KITCHEN

Rame Community Kitchen supports people in crisis on the Rame Peninsula. South East Cornwall.

The kitchen supplies frozen meals cooked by our own chefs as well as fresh and tinned/dry food. We use food chain surplus wherever we can and donations from shops, businesses and the public including allotment veg. We are a club - users are members, actively encouraged to join in: many are now volunteers at our hub.



The Peninsula Trust runs local one-toone support (welfare, benefits, debt, mental health) so we know the effect Covid-19 has had on our community.

The need for support with food is huge - we are currently feeding over 160 people three times a week, from large families to those living on their own. The feedback has been brilliant and more people are signing up to be members each week.

What your donation could provide:

- £10: Ingredients for meals for three people over a week:
- £25: A full-scale Christmas Dinner delivery, everything included.

CORNWALL COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

The Cornwall Community Foundation (CCF) aims to improve the lives of others in Cornwall, those who are isolated, disadvantaged and vulnerable.

As a foundation, we have the expertise and local knowledge to help donors support the local causes and charities they care about, enabling them to make an impact through their giving.

We identify issues of importance for our donors and facilitate investment to grassroots, front line, volunteer led organisations on their behalf, making a real difference to people's lives across Cornwall

The CFF's Crisis Fund makes small awards, usually £30 but up to a

maximum of £90, to the most vulnerable individuals within Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly, who are suffering immediate hardship. This includes helping individuals who are currently homeless or in danger of becoming homeless with immediate needs such as short term accommodation, transport, clothing and food.

Wanting to do something to help reach out to the lonely, socially excluded and the homeless and inspired by the Prayer Shawl Ministry in America, Jackie Holden and a small team of knitters started **Cornwall Praver Shawls.**

Before beginning each shawl, prayers and blessings are imbued into the varn. The prayers continue throughout the knitting of the shawl and upon completion, a final

blessing is offered, before the shawl is given to someone in need.

Some shawls are intended for specific recipients, identified by Jackie. Other shawls are made to help people in need, including those who find

SAMARITANS OF CORNWALL AT TRURO 12

In today's increasingly stressful and hectic world, more and more people are looking to Samaritans as a means of helping them cope with day-to-day issues, crises and disasters.

Run entirely by volunteers and funded from donations and fund raising, Samaritans of Cornwall at Truro is the only branch of this organisation based solely in the Duchy. Last year, volunteers in the branch responded to 52.000 calls for help. We are available via phone, email, text, SMS and faceto-face.

Whatever the caller wants to discuss. Samaritans offer a confidential, nonjudgmental space to explore what is going on. It costs £50,000 a year to run the Truro branch. We rely entirely on donations to maintain our services.

Newquay Orchard is a beautiful sevenacre community space for people and for nature. Designed to provide environmental education, employability training and community events; it is an urban greenspace welcome to everyone. Since planting the first apple tree in 2015 Newquay Orchard has worked with over 700 volunteers to build this community hub. It has become a place where people with different backgrounds, experiences, passions and skills can work together outdoors.

Newquay has high levels of social deprivation, poor mental health and physical health. People in the town have also been greatly affected by lack of housing and the Covid-19 pandemic. Demand for the support we offer through our volunteering and training has grown significantly as we have shown Newquay

With our support, people are exploring and embracing the strengths of their quieter qualities, and practising their ability to express themselves, while redefining what it means to be 'quiet' as part of a community of people on the same path.

We are a social enterprise run by coaches with first-hand experience offering 1:1 support, suicide interventions, courses and connecting gatherings. Our aim is to help people to show up confidently as their true self, feel a sense of belonging & grow to love their true quiet nature.

QUIET CONNECTIONS

Ultimately, the people that we work with want to connect with others and show up in life making a difference to other people's lives and/or the planet and we all know the world benefits when compassionate people feel able to show up and be seen.

All Saints Community Centre,

Tuckingmill provides grass root support for all vulnerable people within the community, including crisis support, counselling, mental health first aid and suicide prevention support, advocacy and a community larder.

The centre endeavours to provide recreational, social, cultural, educational and training opportunities, promote social justice and social inclusion to make the community stronger and a happier and healthier and safer place to live. We work with at risk individuals, whether from abuse, being street homeless, or at risk of self harm. We are running many new projects, groups, activities and services in response to increased need and have recently employed counsellor and sessional workers. What your donation could help provide:

- £15: helps fund one hour for vulnerable people to work with a community or sessional worker
- £25: helps fund counselling support for people who can not move on with their lives due to bereavement and loss, or mental ill health
- £50: helps fund gardening activities for vulnerable people to do community gardening, grow food together and gain improved physical, mental and social wellbeing

Rebuild South West, run by ex-military personnel, works with individuals to restore lives, rebuild properties, and bring social improvement.

Activities range from tailored coaching courses for local authorities and organisations, through to ambitious full-scale renovation and rebuild projects empowering individuals with new skills and life changing experiences.

From the ex-service community to the long term unemployed, we help to turn lives around with rewarding, practical and motivational projects. A team of skilled tradespeople provide project management, renovation work and training expertise to support education, training and development

The Haven in Looe is a dedicated youth centre providing a safe space where young people can get support, have fun and learn new skills.

Young people are given the opportunity to participate in activities promoting fitness and wellbeing at a time when many young people have missed out on so much because of the restrictions of the pandemic.

THE PZ@PZ PLAYZONE

The Penlee Cluster of Churches continue their commitment to families and young people in a town with some of the highest deprivation figures in Cornwall.

The Pz@Pz PlayZone offers a safe much valued indoor space for children to play and for parents, grandparents and carers to meet and be offered support. COVID means we have to run differently – and need extra funds for cleaning and for new appropriate equipment.

During summer this year we ran our Holiday Club for vulnerable children and we are planning already for 2022. We especially focus on offering local teenagers experiences of leadership to encourage self-confidence and raise aspirations. What your donations could provide: £20: Extra cleaning required to keep the Playzone open during covid; £25: A week at holiday club including breakfast and lunch.

Established in 2003, Cornwall Advocacy

is an independent charity providing free specialist advocacy for people with learning disabilities in Cornwall. We are working to empower people with learning disabilities to have their voices heard, and make choices and decisions about their lives.

Our mission is to provide support for children, young people and adults with a learning disability in Cornwall and Isles of Scilly to enable them to take more control over their lives.

We provide one-to-one advocacy covering a range of issues for individuals. For instance, we are supporting people to move forward and recover from the pandemic, and to identify what is important to them. We also host advocacy groups, including creative
